The following are prohibited acts:

7508.2

(d) <mark>Unlawfully entering any private building or secured area without the consent of the owner, or of the person in legal possession thereof, at the time of repossession.</mark>

7500.1

(s) "Private building" means and includes any dwelling, outbuilding, or other enclosed structure.
